

4.1 Separation of Concerns

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The architecture separates conceptual meaning, logical [Structure](#), domain specialization, implementation mapping, deployment mechanics, testability, and [Evidence](#).

This separation allows each layer to evolve without redefining the layers inside it. For example, a later implementation profile may realize a [Communication Endpoint](#) as a DDS Topic, but that mapping does not change the conceptual meaning of [Communication Endpoint](#).

Section 9 defines the Separation of Concerns Model used to apply this principle.

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
